Animal Health Requirements

For official rules regarding the Animal Health Requirements for Exhibition see the State of Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, Division of Animal Industry Chapter 5C-4.005 documentation located on our website, www.thefairexhibits.com or go directly to at <http://www.thefairexhibits.com/pdf/animalhealthreg.pdf>

General Livestock Rules:

1. Exhibitor must complete the entry form with the breed and date of birth of animals to be entered.
2. The Fair will provide sand, straw or shavings for bedding. All exhibitors must care for their own animals for the entire duration of The Fair. The exhibitor must buy or bring his own feed.
3. If an exhibitor has more than one animal entered in any single class, that exhibitor may ask assistance from another youth, but is responsible for leading the animals into the ring and showing each individually to the judge.
4. The management of The Fair and the Exhibits Department reserve the right to remove and disqualify any exhibitor from any show, sale or contest for lack of cooperation.
5. Animals will be weighed a maximum of two times within the allotted weigh-in period.
6. Exhibitors will be required to furnish registration papers which will be checked by the Show Secretary as evidence of ownership of the animal, as well as date of birth, sire and dam, and such other information as usually required on registration certificates.
7. Any Market swine not meeting the minimum weight of 200 pounds will be disqualified and will not be able to participate in any event, the maximum sale weight is 270 pounds.
8. **If a Market exhibitor is a member of 4H and FFA, they may enter under one organization only, not both.**
9. **Write a Thank You letter to The Miami-Dade County Fair and Exposition, Inc. and mail to Carol Douglass. Checks for premiums will not be issued without the "Thank You: letters. Deadline for "Thank You" letters will be May 30, 2010.**

Youth Market Swine Show and Sale:

1. **A complete and concise record book will be required at the time of check-in.**
2. The Miami-Dade County Fair and Exposition, Inc. does not guarantee a profit on any market swine.

3. Only Miami-Dade County, 4-H and FFA members active in the 2009-2010 4-H/Agriculture Education program can enter.
4. Any market swine not meeting the minimum weight of 200 pounds will be disqualified and will not be able to participate in any event, the maximum sale weight is 270 pounds.
5. Gilts and barrows under one year of age may be entered.
6. Ownership of animal must be established by November 7, 2009.
7. Market swine will be sold by the order in which they are placed by the judge in the Market Market swine Show.
8. **This is a TERMINAL SHOW for all Market Swine. The Market Swine will be sold in the Market Animal Auction on Saturday, March 27, 2010. Market Swine will check-out on Sunday, March 28, 2010 at 10:00pm and WILL be sent for processing.**

Showmanship:

1. Exhibitors will **NOT** automatically be entered into this class.
2. **In order to compete in this event, exhibitors are required to list this class on their entry form.**
3. Exhibitors can earn achievement points by participating in this class.
4. Exhibitors are required to be clean, neat, dressed in the official club/chapter attire. Closed-toe boots or shoes are required.
5. In order to be eligible to enter into this contest, all exhibitors must adhere to the attire regulations.
6. Exhibitors must show their own animal.
7. Exhibitors will be judged on a Modified Danish System.

Fitting & Grooming

1. Exhibitors will **NOT** automatically be entered into this class.
2. **In order to compete in this event, exhibitors are required to list this class on their entry form.**
3. Exhibitors can earn achievement points by participating in this class.
4. Should the number of exhibitors exceed arena capacity, exhibitors will be divided into heats.
5. Any student entering Fitting and Grooming competition must groom their own animal without adult participation.
6. Clipping of hogs is not a standard in industry practice, because it causes problems with the processing of the animal.
7. Any hog whose hair length appears to be less than 1/2 inch may have length of hair checked.
8. Hogs with hair that has been clipped to less than 1/2 inch, will be disqualified.
9. The Fair authority reserves the right to check any hair length by running a marked comb over the animal.
10. The use of oil or powders on a market hog is absolutely prohibited, animals in violation will be disqualified and forfeit all premiums and monies.

Record Book

1. **A record book must begin on November 7, 2009.**
2. Record books must be completed by the exhibitor, with advisors/leaders certifying their authenticity.
3. **This class is mandatory, a complete record book is required at check-in for any student to receive awards or premiums.**
4. Grading is based on the Modified Danish System: Blue, Red and White.
5. Record books will be judged based on neatness, accuracy, spelling, and grammar.

If there are no entries meeting the quality standards for any special awards, no award will be given.

Exhibitor Attire:

Required dress code:

1. All exhibitors to be clean and neat.
2. Black jeans and white collar shirts.
3. No caps or hats.
4. Closed toes shoes or boots.
5. When showing it is mandatory to wear official FFA or 4-H attire.

Note: When not showing, it is strongly recommended that FFA/4-H members wear their club uniform while on the fairgrounds.

Chapters/Club Exhibits:

The chapter/club must designate one student that will compete in all events. This student will be the representative for the market animal seminar, the market show, the record book, showmanship, and fitting and grooming and all other competitions

The age of the student will determine the division of their competition (i.e., jr., int., or sr.). Chapter designate their exhibitor by March 1, 2010. If a designee's has not been selected and their name received by March 1, 2010 the project will be allowed to show and compete for animal premiums ONLY. The chapter/club appointed exhibitor will not qualify for achievement premiums. All chapters/clubs must have a Federal ID number to enter.

Protests and Complaints:

All protests and/or complaints against any shows, exhibitors, animals, and or any show/fair affiliates must be submitted in writing after The Fair has ended. Protests and or complaints will not be acknowledged during The Fair by any superintendent and or fair official. You may mail your protest and/or complaints after the conclusion of The Fair to:
