#### Classes - Books

Class 1 - Books - Creative Fictional Stories

Class 2 - Books - Modeled Stories with Innovations

Class 3 - Books - Concept Development

#### Rules:

1. Exhibit entry ID labels must be filled out and secured to the back of the book (top left corner). To obtain these labels in advance, please contact the Exhibits Office at The Fair™. Since you do not pre-enter for this class, you will not receive any computer generated tags.
2. Each teacher is limited to **5** single entry books **OR 3** book entries. (When registering your books, remember this is Division 11, Class 1, 2, or 3 and **not** Creative Writing.)
3. Place all books and 1 entry form with titles and names of the students entering books in a large envelope. Be sure to indicate on the entry form if this was a group entry and the names of those in that group who worked on the book (**group entries are permitted for grades K – 2 only, and are limited to 12 students per book with a maximum of 3 group books per teacher**). On the outside of the envelope write school name, teacher name, number of books and their classes.
4. Books must be written and illustrated BY STUDENT. (**No copied, traced, cut out, ditto, or computer generated pictures will be accepted!**)
5. Books must be constructed in a manner that is visually appealing and durable. If staples or brads are used they must be securely covered by plastic or library tape so that the intended user will not be harmed. (Scotch tape, masking tape and electrical tape **WILL NOT** be accepted).
6. Books must be written in ink or typed. Pencil will be accepted only if the pages are laminated or plastic coated. This rule applies for illustrations also.
7. Superintendents reserve the right to disqualify any entry which does not conform to the above rules.
8. Creative fictional stories: Stories in this class must have a beginning, middle and end with a strong development of character, setting or plot. **Stories with violence will not be accepted.**

9. Modeled stories with story innovations: These are stories with a new twist (example: Cinderella stories: Cinderella, The Egyptian Cinderella, etc). Copied text or re-telling will not be accepted. Innovations must be original.
10. Concept Development: ABC Books, Numbers, Shapes, "First Books", etc.
11. **NO** reports, journals, poetry, plays, essays, collections, or non-fiction books of any kind will be accepted. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

#### Includes:

Games, puppets or marionettes, puzzles, stuffed toys and dolls. All other items will be disqualified. Child Development will accept safe, durable, handmade items designed to educate and/or creatively develop children twelve years of age or under. See specific classes for further information. Items will be randomly selected for "testing" by adults and children for durability.

#### Games

1. Each teacher is limited to 5 game entries.
2. Entry tags must be secured to the inside of the box lid (See rule 5).
3. Games must be handmade, durable and totally original. Drawings on the board must be drawn by the student, **NOT** copied, traced or computer generated.
4. No pins, staples, tape of any kind in the construction of the games and the game box will be accepted.
5. Games must be packaged in a sturdy box. (Suggestion: boards may be folded to fit into the box.) The box must be decorated and include the game title and the name of the author. Pizza boxes and gift boxes are acceptable. If pictures are used, they must be drawn, by the student.
6. **Game Boards:** Maximum size of game board is 16" x 16" (NO EXCEPTIONS) Minimum consistency of game board must be poster board weight, however if using posterboard weight, it must be laminated.
7. **Game pieces and instructions:** All writing and/or drawing should be in ink or typewritten. Instructions and game cards must be clearly written and laminated. All game pieces must be handmade (except dice). Game pieces must be placed in a container within the game box to keep from being lost.
8. All games must be playable. Entries falling apart will be disqualified.
9. Superintendents reserve the right to **DISQUALIFY** any entry which does not conform to the above rules.

#### Puppets and Marionettes

1. Each teacher is limited to 5 puppets and/or marionette entries.
2. Entry tags must be secured to the back of each entry. Remove claim tag and retain for check-out.
3. No pins, staples, tape of any kind in the construction of the puppets and marionettes will be accepted.
4. All items in this class must be handmade by the students. They must be totally original and durable! No dittos, pre-stamped fabric articles or kits of any kind will be accepted.
5. All puppets and marionettes must be ready for display, "self-standing". (Wooden dowels or plastic bottles full of sand make great stands.)
6. All puppets and marionettes must be playable. Entries are randomly selected for testing by adults and age intended children, and checked for durability. Entries falling apart will automatically be disqualified.
7. Superintendents reserve the right to **DISQUALIFY** any entry which does not conform to the above rules.

#### Puzzles

1. Each teacher is limited to 5 puzzle entries.
2. Entry tags must be secured to the back of the puzzle. Remove claim tag and retain for check-out.
3. No pins, staples or tape in the construction of the puzzles will be accepted.

- All puzzles must be totally original and durable. Drawn by the student NOT copied, traced or computer generated. Handmade by the student NO dittos or kits of any kind will be accepted. Minimum consistency of puzzle must be poster board weight, however, if using poster board weight it must be laminated.
- Each entry should include a separate copy of the picture to be solved and packaged together in a box or other durable manner. The size of the finished puzzle should be no more than 24" x 24".
- All puzzles must be playable. Entries are randomly selected for testing by adults and age intended children, and checked for durability. Entries falling apart will be automatically disqualified.
- Superintendents reserve the right to **DISQUALIFY** any entry which does not conform to the above rules.

### **Stuffed Toys and Dolls**

- Each teacher is limited to 5 stuffed toy and/or doll entries. (Pillows and ceramic statues are not accepted in this division).
- Entry tags must be secured to the back of each entry. Remove claim tag and retain for check-out.
- No pins, staples, or tape of any kind in the construction of the entries will be accepted.
- All items in this class must be handmade by the students, including accessories. They must be totally original and durable. No pre-stamped fabric articles or kits of any kind will be accepted.
- All dolls and stuffed toys must be playable. Entries are randomly selected for testing by adults and age intended children, and checked for durability. Entries falling apart will be automatically disqualified.
- Superintendents reserve the right to **DISQUALIFY** any entry which does not conform to the above rules.

### **Rules:**

- Competition is open to students in Miami-Dade County public or private, elementary, middle or senior high school.
- Each participating school is expected to provide teachers to assist with judging.
- Sixth graders in an elementary school are to be entered in the middle level of the appropriate competition. Ninth graders in a middle school are to be entered in the senior high level of the appropriate competition.
- Decision of the judges is final.
- For additional rules, refer to the class entered in the following sections.

### **Multimedia Competition:**

Entries will be written using an multimedia application, for example, Macromedia Director, Microsoft PowerPoint, Keynote, or HyperStudio.

The project must be centered on an educational theme. The presentation cannot be displayed through a web browser but only through a stand-alone application.

### **Classes:**

Class 1 - Multimedia Competition - Elementary School

Class 2 - Multimedia Competition - Middle School

Class 3 - Multimedia Competition - High School

### **Specific Entry Requirements:**

- Entries can be written by an individual or by team. Teams cannot exceed 5 members.
- No more than 2 entries per school.
- Entries must adhere to all copyright laws.
- Each team provides its own equipment and requisite software on the day of competition.
- Each team is allowed 5 minutes to present its project to the judges.
