Rules:

1. Each teacher is limited to **5** single entry books **OR 3** book entries. (When registering your book, remember this is ESOL Child Development, not Creative Writing.)
2. Exhibit ID labels must be filled out and secured to the back of the book (**TOP LEFT CORNER**). To obtain these labels in advance, please call the Exhibits Office at The Fair™. Since you don't pre-enter for this division, you will not receive any computer generated tags.
3. Place all books and one entry form with titles and names of the students entering book classes (see below) on the outside of the envelope. Be sure to indicate on the entry form if this was a group entry and the names of those students in that group who worked on the book (**group entries are permitted only for K - 2 only, and are limited to 12 students per book with a maximum of 3 group books per teacher**).
4. Books must be written entirely in English and illustrated BY THE STUDENT(S). (**No copied, traced, cut-out, computer generated pictures or dittos will be accepted!**)
5. Books must be constructed in a manner that is visually appealing and durable. If staples or brads are used they must be securely covered by plastic or library tape so that the intended user will not be harmed. (Scotch tape, masking tape and electrical tape **WILL NOT** be accepted).
6. Books must be written in ink or typed. Pencil will be accepted only if laminated or plastic coated. (This rule applies for illustrations also).
7. Superintendents reserve the right to disqualify any entry which does not conform to the above rules.
8. **Teachers: Please proof read entries before submitting them. Excessive or distracting errors in spelling, punctuation and/or grammar may result in disqualification or lower awards. Correct punctuation of dialogue in short stories is necessary.**

Books:

1. **Creative Fictional Stories:** Stories in this class must have a beginning, middle and end with strong development of character, setting and/or plot.
2. **Modeled Stories with Story Innovations:** These are stories with a new twist (example: Cinderella stories: Cinderella, The Egyptian Cinderella, etc.) Copied text or re-telling will not be accepted. Innovations must be original.
3. **Concept Development:** ABC Books, Numbers, Shapes, "First" Books, etc.
4. **NO REPORTS, JOURNALS, POETRY, PLAYS, ESSAYS, COLLECTIONS, OR NON-FICTION BOOKS OF ANY KIND WILL BE ACCEPTED. NO EXCEPTIONS!**

- Open to all students in the ESOL program (Levels 1, 2, 3, 4) in grades K - 12.
- An exhibit ID sticker/label must be attached to the BACK of each entry. To obtain these labels in advance, please contact the Exhibits office at The Fair™ for the number of labels that will be needed for each entry. Please request only the amount needed. Since you do not pre-enter for this division, you will not receive any computer generated entry tags.
- The student's name, school, grade and ESOL level must be written on the front of each entry.
- Each exhibitor is limited to one class/type of entry.**
- Each entry must be the original work of one individual.
- Teachers: To submit entries, you must enclose the original copy of your Fair entry form with the students' names, listed in **ALPHABETICAL ORDER**. Place all entries and entry forms in a large manila envelope and clearly mark the name of the school, teacher, grade, number of entries and type(s) of entries enclosed on the outside of the envelope.
- Entries must be easily readable, written or typed, **have only one poem or essay per page, one side only and mounted on construction paper**. Entries mounted on tag board will be disqualified. Do not fold entries.
- Poetry (plus any art work) must be mounted to these size specifications: Haiku must be mounted on 6" x 9" construction paper. Free verse, rhymed verse, short stories & essays **MUST** be mounted on 8" x 10" construction paper.
- Limericks and Diamante MAY NOT BE SUBMITTED.**
- Modeled entries must include a copy of the original poem attached to the back of the entry.
- Acrostics (K-5 ONLY) and Haiku (K-5 ONLY) may be submitted by students.
- Entries may be reproduced and used by the Miami-Dade County Fair & Exposition®. (Original entries will be returned).
- Superintendents reserve the right to disqualify any entry which does not conform to the established rules.
- Entries must be typed, fourth through twelfth grade.
- Teachers: Please proof read entries before submitting them. Excessive or distracting errors in spelling, punctuation, and/or grammar may result in disqualification or lower awards. Correct punctuation of dialogue in short stories is necessary.**
